Last week Professor Davis used the Haber-Bosch synthesis of ammonia to illustrate reversible reactions and how they can be driven to completion. He then showed the stepwise mechanism of the Wöhler synthesis of urea from ammonium cyanate. This week we will briefly review the hybrid orbitals of carbon and sigma and pi bonds. Professor Davis will discuss acid-base chemistry in relation to organic acids and bases. In the food science series Dean Russin will go into the chemistry of the Maillard reaction which leads to browning of meats and gravies as we observed in last week's cooking of a chicken dinner.

Deconstruct several specific examples of pseudoscience to see how its various features work. You'll investigate the pseudoscience behind iridology (the idea that our irises reflect our health), photographs that claim to capture ghosts, psychic abilities such as precognition, spontaneous human combustion, and more.34 min


